Austria(Gvmt)-GM When I mentioned the Italian centre count I did so assuming that it was obvious to anyone that a high count represented the only realistic goal that Italy could possible achieve. Italy has no chance of winning or even a draw and that has been a reality for many seasons. Of course if you want to theorise, or rather fantasise, then I agree that a count of 16 to Austria's 18 will mean that Italy has lost. ((That is reality - not theory or fantasy!)) But you seem to be saying that there is absolutely no difference between losing with 16 centres or 0 centres. ((Correct!)) I am totally in favour of pushing for outright victory whenever possible but one has to be realistic and one's position in some games, not necessarily because one has a low centre count but often because of the weight of hostile forces dictates that defeat must be accepted. When that point is reached there is a choice between throwing in the towel, which follows from your line of reasoning, or trying to salvage something from the disaster by reaching as high a centre count as possible. At least that is how I see the game being played and I would not criticise anyone who gratefully accepts the inevitable and strives to end the game on a respectable footing.

1983 Annual Zine Poll

Richard Walkerdine has recently announced details of this year's zine poll. In a nutshell they are :-

- 1) Eligibility Any European zine which is an amateur publication concerned with postal games playing and which has published at least 2 issues since Jan 1st 1983.
- 2) Voters To vote for a zine a voter must read it regularly. A voter must vote for at least 2 zines.
- 3) Voting method Votes should be given to each zine in the range 1 (low) to 10 (high) to one decimal place.
- 4) Assessment Results will be calculated by a preference matrix. The average votes method will also be shown for reference only.
- 5) Inclusion A zine must receive votes from at least 8% of the voters in order to be included in the results.
- 6) Deadline Votes to Richard Walkerdine, 144 Stoughton Rd, Guilford, Surrey GU2 6PG by Thursday July 28th 1983.
