THE 22ND DIPLOMACY ZINE POLL

Ryk Downes has announced details of this year's Zine Poll.

You may vote if you have regularly read Diplomacy zines during 1994, and can vote for a Diplomacy zine if you have seen at least four of its issues during 1994.

'Diplomacy zines' are defined as zines that run (or ran) postal Diplomacy or a Diplomacy variant or are allied to the postal Diplomacy hobby (the latter group includes *Greatest Hits* and *Take That You Fiend*, but excludes services zines such as *Hobby News*, *Mission from God* and *The Numbers Game*).

Zines are eligible if they are published in UK or Republic of Ireland and have published at least four issues during 1994 (folded zines are still eligible).

You vote by listing the eligible zines that you see regularly in order of preference and giving each one a vote between 1 (low) and 10 (high), preferably on an official voting form, and sending it to Ryk Downes at 63 Hirst Wood Road, Saltaire, Shipley, West Yorkshire BD18 4BU by 31 December 1994. Send an SSAE for the results booklet.

ESSEN GAMES FAIR

A lot of extra floor space was given to computer games and *Magic* style trading games but this was achieved by expanding the number of exhibition halls in use, not by cutting back on the space available for boardgames.
