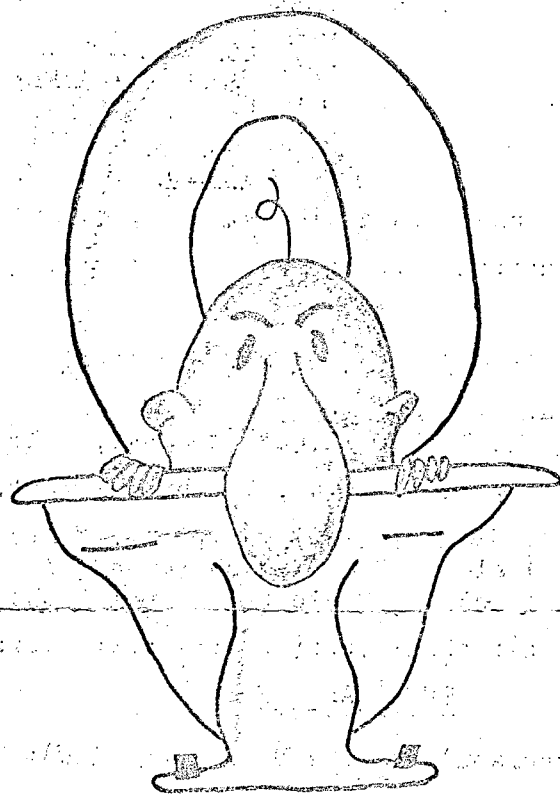

Italian Victory Statement

This was a highly enjoyable game, made so by everyone taking a full part throughout the game.

My original plan was to ally with Russia and take out first Austria and then Turkey. Turkey's attack on Russia robbed me of an ally and left the Franco-German alliance in a strong position. With Austria and Turkey taking longer to die than expected the Franco-German alliance simply had to be broken up. Germany in particular was looking very strong and seemed set to take Russia in the back, whilst France could be heading my way.

I wrote two letters to John Meadon urging him to attack Germany while he was looking the other way and promised him a hard time should he enter the Med. I had almost given up hope when John phoned me a couple of days before the deadline and agreed to do as I asked.

This changed the game my way. With France and Germany locked in combat, Russia was free to help me in the South East and Turkey was soon finished. Andrew naturally wanted revenge on Germany and asked for my help. I saw this as a good opportunity for a stab and with Russia moving north again, I moved in behind him to take the whole south-east corner with hardly a struggle, and with it the game.

This was a particularly satisfying game to win as until Pete Cousins' lapse at the end no-one missed any orders. From my point of view the game went like a dream and once the Franco-German alliance was broken, everything I tried worked beautifully and the win fell into place with what seemed like indecent haste!

My particular thanks to Andrew Waldie for being such a good ally and such an excellent stab victim! Also thanks to John Meadon for keeping his word throughout and coming a well deserved second. Finally thanks to Richard, for his hard work at the typewriter, and for suffering all of us with good grace.

GM's Comments

Tony is a fine player, and his performance in this game gives added proof of that. Any win with Italy is quite an achievement, but to do it as quickly and easily as he did in this game -- bearing in mind that he had some very experienced and talented opponents -- is a really remarkable effort. I have no doubt that the amount of diplomacy required to ensure that his enemies were always too busy fighting each other to have very much time to watch him was very much greater than his victory statement implies. And his moves of 1907, when he finished off Turkey, stabbed Russia and turned on France, and gained a total of six more centres in one year was nothing short of classic.

For the record, although Pete Cousins dropped out he hasn't been blacklisted as he's already been in touch with me to explain that his lapse was due to circumstances beyond his control. A fine game and one that gave me real pleasure to GM. I hope all the players will be back sometime to play here again.
